OUR MISSION SO FAR

The Reaumont Foundation is fiercely committed to impacting the lives of those faced with pancreatic cancer by funding research, providing financial assistance to families, and low-cost housing for use during treatment at the nation's #1 ranked cancer hospital, MD Anderson Cancer Center.

Pancreatic Cancer Research

We strive to work towards better outcomes and treatment by directly funding cutting edge research at the nation's top oncology hospitals. We support research to advance the development of early detection and treatment options available for those diagnosed with one of the most deadly cancers.

Assisting Families

We dedicate funds, effort, and time to families faced with this diagnosis. We tailor financial assistance to the individual family, knowing that every situation is different and unique. We meet with families one on one to provide compassionate assistance with transportation to treatment, medication costs, cost of living, supplies, caregiver support, lodging, bills, and other day to day needs.

Homes of Hope

Often, the best chance of a successful outcome for a patient with pancreatic cancer is to travel to a hospital far from home. Travel costs add up quickly, especially when patients consider lodging, transportation, and food. Patients who need housing for extended cancer treatments may need to spend several hundred to several thousand dollars, depending on their length of stay. When considering these costs, it can feel incredibly overwhelming to move forward with treatment far from home.

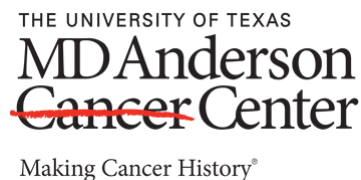
Homes of Hope aims to ease the financial burden of housing, provide better access to the nation's top cancer hospitals, and provide a "home away from home" to families during their most difficult days.

OUR 2023 IMAPCT - RESEARCH GRANTS

The Reaumont Foundation is reinforcing its commitment to pancreatic cancer research through a \$1 million investment over five years.

A significant portion, \$500,000, is dedicated to the MD Anderson Cancer Center, supporting the first scholar program in the Pancreatic Cancer department. This commitment aims to assist an early physician-scientist in establishing accreditation and forging a career path in pancreatic cancer research. The remaining \$500,000 is allocated to the University of Arizona Cancer Center, where the five-year commitment accelerates research initiatives targeting the prevention, detection, and eventual cure of pancreatic cancer. This funding establishes a program facilitating tissue collection and supports critical trials, including immunotherapy for patients with advanced pancreatic cancer.



PROJECTS	DETAILS
MD Anderson Cancer Center: \$500,000 over 5 years	This continues to fund the first scholar program within the Pancreatic Cancer department of MD Anderson. The five-year commitment will help fund an early physician-scientist establish accreditation within the field and help mold a career path in pancreatic cancer research. This program will be overseen by MD Anderson's Pancreatic Moonshot Program co-leader, Dr. Anirban Maitra.
The University of Arizona Cancer Center: \$500,000 over 5 years	This five-year commitment will provide research initiatives and accelerate the ability to prevent, detect, and eventually cure pancreatic cancer. Specifically, this donation establishes a program to facilitate tissue collection. The funding will also support critical trials involving immunotherapy for patients with advanced pancreatic cancer.

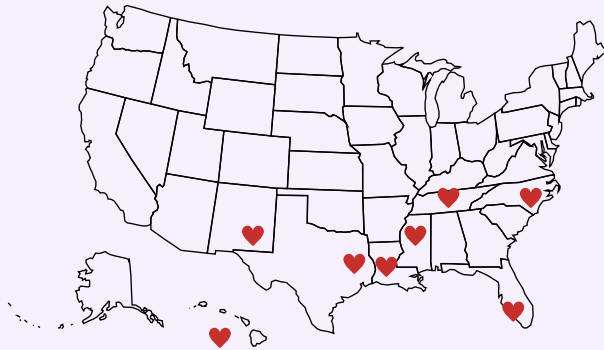

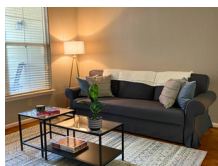

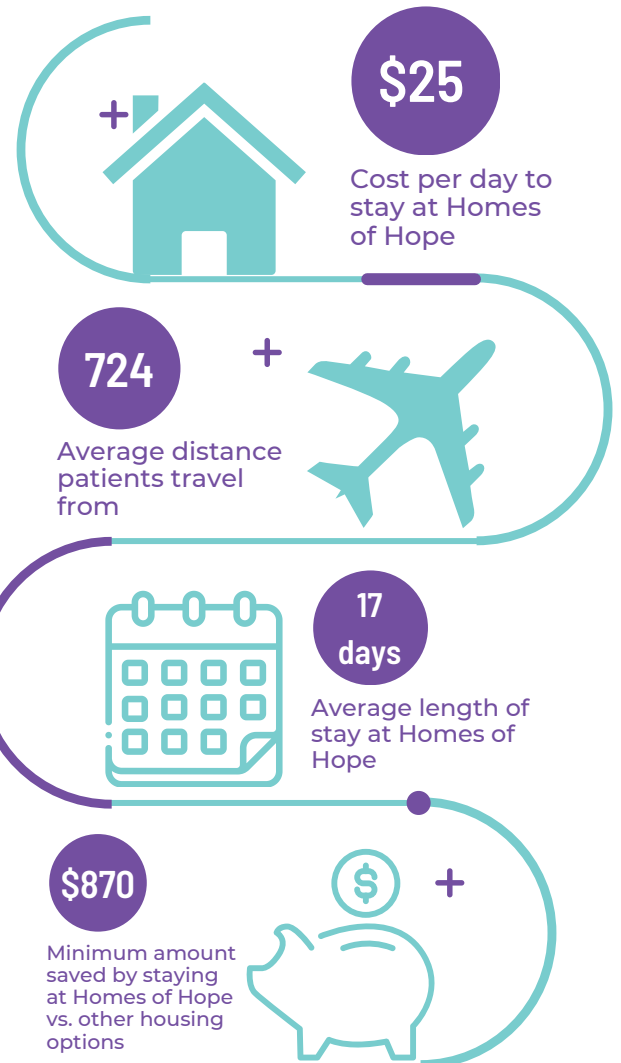
